ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS is available without a doctor's prescription, for you to treat a mild illness. Nevertheless, you still need to use ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS carefully to get the best results from it.

- Keep this leaflet. You may need to read it again.
- Do not share ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS with any other person.
- Ask your pharmacist or healthcare provider if you need more information or advice.
- You must see a doctor if your symptoms worsen or do not improve after 10 days.

1. What ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS is and what it is used for

ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS is an analgesic medication containing paracetamol used to treat

mild to moderate pain and fever.

2. What you need to know before you take ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS

Do not take ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS:

• if you are hypersensitive (allergic) to paracetamol or any of the other ingredients of

ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS (listed in section 6).

• if your liver function is severely impaired.

Warnings and precautions

Take special care:

• as this product contains paracetamol which may be fatal in overdose. In the event of

overdosage or suspected overdose and notwithstanding the fact that the person may be

asymptomatic, the nearest doctor, hospital or Poison Centre must be contacted

immediately.

if you take more than the recommended dosage, as excess doses of Paracetamol may

cause severe liver damage.

if you have liver or kidney disease.

to not administer to children under 6 years of age.

Consult a doctor if no relief is obtained from the recommended dosage. Do not use

continuously for more than 10 days without consulting a doctor.

Children and adolescents

Do not give ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS to children younger than 6 years old.

Other Medicines and ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS

Always tell your health care professional if you are taking any other medicine, including complementary or

traditional medicines.

ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS with food and drinks

ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS has no known interactions with food and drinks.

Pregnancy, breastfeeding and fertility

Safety in fertility, pregnancy and lactation has not been established.

If you are pregnant or breastfeeding, think you may be pregnant or are planning to have a baby,

please consult your doctor, pharmacist or other health care professional for advice before taking this

medicine.

Driving and using machines

The effects on ability to drive and use of machines has not been established. It is not always possible

to predict to what extent ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS may interfere with the daily activities of a

patient. Patients should ensure that they do not engage in the above activities until they are aware of

the measure to which ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS affects them.

3. How to take ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS

Do not share medicines prescribed for you with any other person.

Always take ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS exactly as described in this leaflet or as your doctor or

pharmacist has told you. You should check with your doctor or pharmacist if you are unsure.

Adults and children over 12 years of age: 1 to 2 tablets orally every 4 to 6 hours when necessary

(only take a maximum of 8 tablets in 24 hours).

Children 6 to 12 years: ½ to 1 tablet given orally every 3 to 4 times daily when necessary (only to

take a maximum of 4 tablets in 24 hours).

DO NOT EXCEED THE RECOMMENDED DOSE

If you take more ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS than you should

Symptoms of paracetamol overdosage in the first 24 hours include pallor, nausea, vomiting, anorexia

and possibly abdominal pain. Liver damage, which may be fatal, may only appear after a few days.

In the event of overdosage, consult your doctor or pharmacist. If neither is available, seek help at

the nearest hospital or poison control center immediately.

If you forget to take ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS

Do not take / receive a double dose to make up for forgotten individual doses.

4. Possible side effects

ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS can have side effects.

Not all side effects reported for ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS are included in this leaflet. Should your

general health worsen or if you experience any untoward effects while taking ADCO-NAPAMOL

TABLETS, please consult your health care provider for advice.

Tell your doctor immediately if you notice any of the following:

Frequency not known:

Skin rashes

Itchy skin

Severe redness of the skin

Sudden spike in fever after taking a dose

Blood cell disorders

Inflammation of the pancreas

5. How to store ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS

Store all medicines out of reach of children.

Store at or below 25 °C. Protect from light and moisture.

Do not store in bathrooms.

Do not use after the expiry date stated on the packaging.

Do not use ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS if you notice any visible signs of deterioration.

Return all unused medicine to your pharmacist.

Do not dispose of unused medicine in drains or sewerage systems (e.g. toilets).

6. Contents of the pack and other information

What ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS contains

The active substance is:

Paracetamol 500 mg

The other ingredients are:

Colloidal silica, magnesium stearate, maize starch, potassium sorbate 0.12% *m/m* (preservative).

What ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS looks like and contents of the pack

ADCO-NAPAMOL TABLETS are white to off white, round, flat tablet with beveled edges and a

score line on one side. They come in 10, 20, 100 tablets in aluminium foil/clear PVC blister packs

and 5 000 tablets in square white HDPE buckets with white HDPE handles, natural HDPE

closures & clear LDPE bags (with silica gel sachets). Not all pack sizes are necessarily

marketed.
